RE: Grandfather Status / Jones Bros.

This is your notice that you do not qualify for grandfather status under resolution 2024-10-115 requirements. The resolution states that a quarry must be in operation before 10/28/2025 to be eligible to be grandfathered. TCA 59-8-202 (8) defines operation as means all of the premises, facilities, and equipment and the use thereof in the process of removing and exploring for minerals from a designated surface mine area. You are not in the process of removing any minerals or rock at this time. You may still apply for a permit through the permitting process, however, your quarry must meet the requirements set forth in resolution 2024-10-115 enacted by the DeKalb County Commission.

SECTION V - FEES. (A) Application Fee for Permit to Operate a Quarry, Rock Crusher or Gravel Pit, Cryptocurrency Mine, Landfill, Adult Entertainment or Methadone Clinic. A non-refundable fee of \$150.00 shall be paid to the clerk at the time of filing the application and required accompanying materials. (B) Initial Fee for Permit to Operate a Quarry; Rock Crusher or Gravel Pit, Cryptocurrency Mine, Landfill, Adult Entertainment or Methadone clinic. If the license is granted, the applicant shall pay an initial license fee of \$100.00. (C) Renewal Fee for License to Operate a Quarry, Rock Crusher or Gravel Pit, Cryptocurrency Mine, Landfill, Adult Entertainment or Methadone Clinic an annual fee of \$100.00 shall be required to renew a Permit to operate a quarry, gravel pit, or rock crusher, cryptocurrency mine, landfill, adult entertainment or methadone clinic. (D) The failure to pay the annual renewal fee shall not constitute a forfeiture or ground for revocation of any permit granted under this resolution provided such failure is rectified upon notification by the County Mayor. The foregoing fees shall be in addition to the fees required for a standard business license.

Examine Resolution 2024-10-115, a resolution regulating quarries, to determine any more restrictions, regulations, requirements, or information regarding the regulation of quarries or other regulated commerce in DeKalb County, Tennessee.
